THE FIRST READING

Acts 2: 1-21

*Reader:* Brian Dean

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. THE SERMON

The Bishop

*At the conclusion of the Sermon, the Baptismal party meets the Bishop in front of the Rood Screen. The Bishop says*

The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*The Candidate is presented by her parents and sponsors as follows*

We present Mataya Grace Balfour Hoskin to receive the sacrament of baptism.

*Bishop* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

*Answer* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Answer* I will, with God's help.

*Then the Bishop asks the following questions of the parents and sponsors*

*Bishop* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them

*Bishop* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Bishop* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Bishop* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

*Answer* I do.

*Bishop* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*Bishop* Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* I do.

*The Congregation stands*

*Bishop* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in her life in Christ?

*Answer* **We will.**

*Bishop* Let us now pray for this person who is to receive the sacrament of new birth.

*The People remain standing*

*Gospeller* Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Open her heart to your grace and truth.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Send her into the world in witness to your love.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.  
**People** **Lord, hear our prayer.**  
*Gospeller* Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever.  
**People** **Amen.**

#### THE THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

*Bishop* The Lord be with you.  
**People** **And also with you.**  
*Bishop* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**People** **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their

bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*The Bishop then says*

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Father?  
**People** **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Bishop* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?  
**People** **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?  
**People** **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Bishop* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?  
**People** **I will with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People* **I will with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

*People* **I will with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

*People* **I will with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People* **I will with God's help.**

*The People sit for the Baptism.*

*Bishop* *Mataya Grace Balfour*, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*People* **Amen.**

*The Bishop makes the sign of the cross on the forehead*

*Bishop* I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

*The Bishop, prays over the newly baptized,*

*Bishop* Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

*People* **Amen.**

*The Bishop gives the newly baptized a lighted candle*

*Bishop* Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

*The People stand*

*People* **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**
